Instead, out of their need to survive, they did what they knew how to do, they made things. In many ways, their remote and rugged lives were far from ours today. In other ways, they were not that different. They succeeded, they struggled, they lived. We begin as spectators watching from a distance but through this story we are beckoned closer - to see what they saw and, indeed, read their journaled thoughts. Through this human story you are invited to examine your own life, to question. You are invited to a place of deeper meaning and purpose.
